Job Description

The SNCC Developing Coach positions will be responsible for sport instruction, keeping attendance and skills tracking digitally, in-person and electronic communication with athletes and parents, posting on SNCC social media and executing program plans approved by the SNCC Head Coach Canoe and Kayak for the following programs at South Niagara Canoe Club: (1) ParaPaddling, supporting introduction of persons with disabilities to flatwater kayaking, (2) Paddle All, supporting introduction of persons with intellectual disabilities to flatwater kayaking, (3) Masters Paddling, leading adults and seniors to participate in flatwater kayaking, and (4) Youth Canoe/Kayak U14/U16, introducing flatwater canoe and kayak to youth ages 10-15, (5) Outrigger Canoe, leading adults, seniors and para athletes to participate in flatwater outrigger canoe, (6) Canoe Kids Summer Camp, 8 one week programs, which consists of instruction in safe practices around water, learning about paddling equipment, as well as practice and fun time "on the water" in kayaks, canoes, and dragon boats, as well as dry land games and activities for youth ages 8-13 and (7) Support for Youth Racing Camp - see Canoe Kids camp plus this camp is a 5 week program and focuses on advanced Sprint/Canoe Kayak skills and race preparation. The SNCC Developing Coaches interact with a wide variety of individuals spanning youth, adult, and seniors, as well as persons with disabilities and special needs, both seasoned athletes and beginners to the sports of canoe, kayak, outrigger, and dragon boat. The SNCC Developing Coaches will assist with proper use and storage of equipment and may have the opportunity to work with the SNCC Head Coach Canoe Kayak in developing equipment maintenance skills. The SNCC Developing Coaches will serve an additional function of providing regatta/competition support for the recreational and competitive aspects of the club at the Welland International Flatwater Centre (same location as their place of work), as well as potentially at other regattas both locally and throughout Ontario, including organization of equipment and volunteers to ensure readiness for both fun and competition situations.
